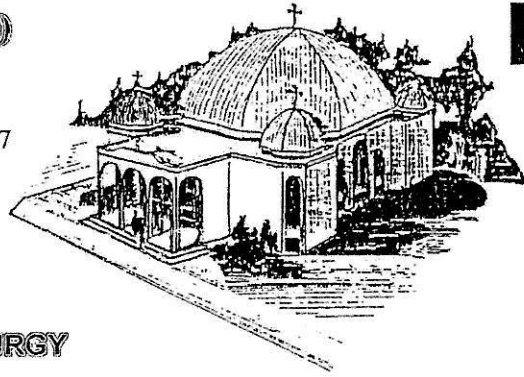

Today I would like to discuss boredom. Do you know what boredom is? It is a kind of *death* in a human being. It means that people have let their interior resources dry up and have reached a sort of coma akin to death. Their motivation is at an absolutely low ebb. Boredom is the forerunner of many emotional problems.

But when we are in love with God, it is *impossible* to be bored! Those who are bored have ceased to love or are in danger of ceasing to be *in love*. How is it possible to be bored when we believe, as St. Paul said, that we can make up what is "wanting" in the sufferings of Christ? In his infinite mercy, God calls to us to become co-redeemers of the world with Him. We are co-redeemers with Christ! He has given us immense power! So our grayish routine isn't gray at all, but resplendent with light – at least it is in our power to make it so.

How does this work in our daily lives? A secretary who "offers up" the tiring task of entering data into a computer is co-redeeming the world with Christ. Cooks making stew, men doing chores, driving trucks, doing repairs – all can save souls from the jaws of hell! How in the name of the All – Holy can you be bored with this data input, cooking, repairing when - in faith - you know everything helps to redeem the world and to render glory to God.
