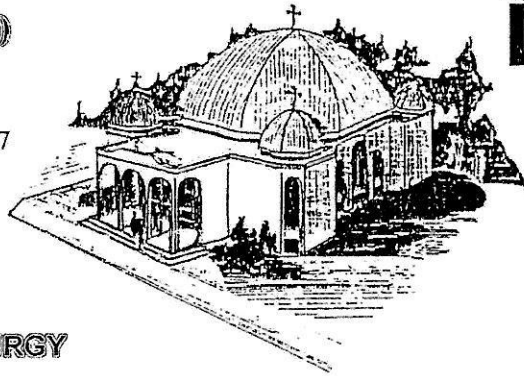

"Be alert and sober minded. Your adversary the devil prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking whom he may devour." 1Peter 5:8

Over the past several decades, the reality of evil spirits wreaking havoc on peoples' lives has been forgotten in many corners of the Church. The reality is that the Enemy continues to prey on humanity, doing what he can to entangle people in his snares.

The movie 'Nefarious' is probably the best movie in recent memory when it comes to depicting how the demonic mind works. The bulk of the movie is a conversation between a prisoner condemned to death for his crimes, who is possessed, and an atheist psychiatrist tasked with determining whether the prisoner is of sound mind and therefore eligible for execution. The demon possessing the man does most of the talking.

The good news is that those who are united to Christ have nothing to fear! By our baptism, by our life of virtue, by our sacramental and prayer life, we have declared our allegiance to Christ the King and renounced the Prince of Darkness. The Enemy still tries to tempt us away from Christ, but we are shielded by Christ, by the prayers of the saints, and by the protection of the Holy Angels.

It's of no benefit to look for the devil around every corner, but it is good to know his tricks and how he works. This movie does a great job at that. I recommend watching this film. If you're unable to make it when it's screened publicly on November 7th, it's available on numerous streaming services. – Fr. Michael
