UKRAINIAN EASTER EGG DECORATING (PYSANKY)

WHEN: Saturday, March 29, 2025

WHERE: St. Mary's Ukrainian Catholic Church Hall

Time: 1 – 4 pm

The Ukrainian school of Language and Dance will be hosting this event.

ALL are welcome!!!

Just bring your own w eggs. We supply the dyes, kistkas and lots of beeswax.

Children under the age of 10 must be accompanied by an adult. Bring mom, dad, older sibling, grandparents!!!

EGG PREPARATION:

- 1. Start with clean, lotion-free hands.
- 2. Choose 6-8 RAW WHITE eggs. Check the shells for cracks or blemishes.

3. Place the eggs in a large bowl filled with <u>LUKEWARM</u> water and 2 <u>TABLESPOONS</u> <u>of WHITE VINEGAR</u> (vinegar cleans the shell and helps it to accept the dye).

4. After 20 minutes, remove the eggs and <u>PAT</u> dry.

5. Store in cardboard egg carton.

6. Take carton out of fridge about $\frac{1/2}{1/2}$ hour before coming to decorate. Eggs_need to be at room temperature.

7. We have all the wax and dyes. SEE YOUR THERE!!!
